For many months, Conservative-led Wealden District It was welcome news that: Council have been lobbying central Government that the centrally-imposed housing targets on the district were too high.

Both the current Leader, Ann Newton, and previous Leader Bob Standley, have met with successive Secretaries of State to put their case, and the recent announcement from Michael Gove has vindicated that lobbying on behalf of residents.



- Centrally-produced housing numbers will no longer be mandatory
- With over 60% of Wealden being protected land. including the AONB, we can reduce the housing numbers required
- Brownfield sites will be a priority
- Planning Inspectors will no longer be able to override sensible local decisions
- More homes in the North and Midlands to ease pressure on the South-East
- Local Neighbourhood Plans are to be strengthened
- Developers to pay higher fees so council planning departments not subsidised by Council Tax payers

"The proposals are welcomed and set to protect our very special environment here in Wealden", said Conservative councillor Bob Standley.

Tackling Climate Change

Wealden Conservatives are committed to net carbon zero by 2050 at the latest.

An action plan is in place and being implemented to achieve this.

Electric vehicle charging points are being installed in many of our off-street car parks in Wealden.

Proposals that the waste vehicles are being converted to run on hydrogenated vegetable oil. This



investment will drastically reduce the amount of

diesel being used by the council.

Wealden were ahead of the game with council offices achieving BREEAM excellence back in 2011.

"We have a sound climate action plan in place and through prudent management of the council's finances, the resources necessary to deliver change at the scale required, as a council and to help enable our communities to follow our lead", says Wealden council leader, Ann Newton.

"We are focused on the things we can do locally to conserve the environment while ensuring Wealden remains a good place to live and work", she added.

Conservative-run Wealden District Council and East **Sussex County Council** have both kept Council Tax increases as low as possible whilst providing high-quality services to our residents.

Thanks to your efforts, Wealden has consistently had the highest recycling rates of any area in East Sussex.

Items which cannot be recycled go to the East Sussex County Council *Power-from-Waste* facility at Newhaven. They are used as fuel to generate electricity – enough to power 20,000 homes.

SE WATER'S MISTAKES

Michael Lunn has called on South East Water to recognise communities such as Rotherfield and Hadlow Down and learn from their mistakes: 2018 (Hadlow Down completely cut off); 2020 (Rotherfield Parish neglected); and 2022 where both were ignored. "It's clear that a lack of knowledge and investment in infrastructure has contributed to the problems", says Michael who pledges to hold them to account.



SPEEDING remains one of the biggest concerns for Michael Lunn. He has actively campaigned with the local PCSOs to raise awareness and commends the parish councils on Speed Indicator Devices which are proving invaluable in educating drivers and gathering speed data.

Michael is campaigning to have a consistent and expanded speed limit on the Western approach on the A272 heading into Hadlow Down where there are 3 pedestrians crossings. Michael Lunn also commends the local community for contributing nearly £3500 towards new Speed Indicator pole on the Western side of the village of Hadlow Down.
