At Uckfield Station In 2013 Barry launched a new transport initiative called 'FOREST EXPLORER'. It is an integrated bus/rail scheme operated by Southern Railway and five bus companies. ■ Barry supports the monthly 'Healthy Walks' programme held on Saturdays at Chelwood Gate




The programme is organised by The Conservation Volunteers. Parliamentary candidate Nus Ghani joined members of the public and Barry at the launch in May last year. There is a monthly free bus-service from Uckfield. This scheme has proved popular with local people and will be resumed this summer.

High Street Parking

Barry supports in principle the proposed highway improvements to Uckfield High Street, but considers some parking spaces should be retained. He has asked the regeneration committee to give careful consideration to the concerns of both residents and traders. Wider pavements, more seating, dedicated unloading bays and new lighting will surely provide better facilities in the town centre, for shoppers, traders, pedestrians, and motorists.



Access to Healthcare



Following concerns from residents who experience difficulty in accessing their doctor or nurse, Barry arranged for a patient survey to be conducted. The results indicated a clear need for transport to four surgeries in the Uckfield area. Funding for
